64/20 News from the NRSGH

The research school does not spend much money these days, but it maintains activity. Two courses were arranged digitally, with good feedback. Other feedback it that there is a good focus on work, but the students miss the social aspect.

The annual PhD conference will be held digitally 29-30 September, 9-12 each day. The booking at Oscarsborg has been moved to April next year, adjacent to the Globvac conference.

The research school is working on creating more courses online, e.g. in academic writing. The Research Council will have a new call out for research schools, with deadline 15 September 2021. NRSHG's period will end in June 2022. It is not possible to apply for a continuation of the existing research school in the new call. There is interest from the school board to apply for the new call.

News on the ECTMIH conference in Bergen 2021

It is decided that this will be a fully digital conference. We keep the dates, but it might be shorter that first planned. A newsletter will be sent out in the beginning of October.

67/20 News from RCN (working group)

The group has made a draft which will be sent on circulation, including to Forum board later this autumn (dates for circulation not ready yet).



68/20 Short information from the board members/observers

Jon Øyvind Odland: Runs master programme and supervision digitally. Apart from some technical problems, it works well.

Nils Daulaire: Is still in US. Colleagues at UiT are Erik Anda and Ingvild Nedberg. The first week of the Global Health course was held digitally in beginning of September. It went very well. Good both in classroom and in breakout rooms.

Ingeborg Havardsson: the reorganization is ongoing. There will be more information about this in November. There will be three deputy directors, one from each department at the Medical Faculty. Ingeborg and Jeanette Magnus are both in a group planning a session at the SDG conference in Bergen in February.

Elin Yli Dvergsdal: At NTNU the Global Health Day 2020 will be held on 22 October. The programme will be streamed, and there will also be presentations on site.

Frode Forland: Days mostly dominated by corona and infection control. The current situation give opportunity to meet members of the government. Repeats in meetings with them that the pandemic demands everyone involved to think international rather than national health now. Frode leads the national "Smittesporingsteam". NIPH continues to get requests about support from abroad. One team is sent from Norway to the Moria camp. There are more requests from WHO, and more teams might be sent out. There is a lot of international activity, e.g. ECCMID (European Congress of Clinical Microbiology & Infectious Diseases), project on school closures. The World Health Summit will be held in Berlin at the end of October.

NIPH works on a new application to Norad where many projects are gathered in one application, including global health preparedness, MCH, build up public health institutions.

Dawit Shawel Abebe: There are challenges in the two NorPart projects regarding student and PhD candidate exchange. It is uncertain whether students from Ethiopia will be able to carry out their planned stay in Norway.

Bente Moen: Home office is recommended for those who can for a new period in Bergen. So far none of the students from the Medical Faculty at UiB have tested positive for corona. Department of global public health and primary care, where CIH is situated, has moved to <u>Alrek health cluster</u> which is closer to CIH. Bergen municipality, UiB, Norce, and Western Norway University of Applied Sciences all have staff working there, and the idea is to promote interdisciplinary collaboration. The official opening will be in October.
